## A Lecture & Demonstration Day

Jeremy James has been making and exhibiting his sculptural ceramic work nationally and internationally now for over 20 years, he is well known for his sculptures of hares, wading birds, cockerels, seals and otters to name but a few.

The day will be an opportunity to see at first hand this ceramic figurative sculptor talking about and making his work. Starting with an illustrated talk, Jeremy will cover topics such as drawing and photographing wildlife on remote islands, snow and ice sculpting in Russia, and of course a career in sculpture.

Lunch will be provided, after which there will be an afternoon of practical demonstrations from Jeremy and the chance to gain an insight into the making of such things as a large strutting cockerel, or perhaps an alert brown hare. Jeremy will explain the complete journey of one of his sculptures from conception through to design and ultimately it's making and firing.
